

CRITERIA: A1 A2 A3 AREA: 2,200 ha

COORDINATES: 28°33'N 114°35'E

ALTITUDE: 200-1,480 m

CONSERVATION STATUS: Established as a provincial-level nature reserve (2,200 ha) in 1981, and upgraded to a national nature reserve in 2007.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Guanshan Nature Reserve is located in the north-west part of Yifeng County, 60 km from the county town. The core area of the reserve is 1,200 ha, and the experimental area is 1,000 ha. The nature reserve is located on the southern slope of Huanggangshan, in the central Jiuling mountains. Most of the area is above 800 m, with the highest point at 1,480 m. The forest in the IBA is well preserved with little human disturbance.

Animals include *Manis pentadactyla*, *Viverricula indica*, *Viverra zibetha*, *Neofelis nebulosa*, *Felis temmincki* and *Lutra lutra*.

ALTITUDE: 12-30 m

CONSERVATION STATUS: The IBA is partially protected in Poyang Hu Nature Reserve (22,400 ha), which was established as at the provincial level in 1983 and upgraded to a national nature reserve in 1989, Nanjishan Nature Reserve (33,000 ha) and Saicheng Nature Reserve (4,000 ha). In 1992, Poyang Hu Nature Reserve was designated as a 'Wetland of International Importance' (or Ramsar site) under the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands, and a 'Class A nature reserve' by WWF and the State Forestry Administration. In the 1994 China Biodiversity Conservation Action Plan, Poyang Hu was listed as a wetland with conservation priority. Poyang Hu Nature Reserve has joined the North-eastern Asia Crane Network, it has frequent contact with IUCN, WWF, the International Crane Foundation and Wetland International, and it formed partnerships with Mai Po Nature Reserve (Hong Kong) and Daurskii Nature Reserve (Russia) in 1989 and 1993, respectively.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Poyang Hu National Nature Reserve is located in northern Jiangxi Province, in the north-western part of Poyang Lake. The nature reserve is located where the Xiu He and Gan Jiang rivers join Poyang Lake, and it includes nine lakes and has a total area of 22,400 ha. In the wet season (April-September) the reserve comprises some 5.65% of the

total surface area of the lake. In the wet season all of the smaller lakes are joined to Poyang Lake, while in the dry season there are exposed mudflats with shallower lakes in between.

NAME: Taohongling Sika Deer Nature Reserve

ALTITUDE: 100-537 m

CONSERVATION STATUS: Established as a provincial-level nature reserve (4,500 ha) in 1981, and upgraded to a national nature reserve (12,500 ha) in 2001.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Taohongling Sika Deer Nature Reserve is located in the central part of Pengze County, and has a core area of 2,667 ha. There are no human residents in the nature reserve, and outside the reserve boundary there are mainly lowland agricultural lands. The elevation increases inside the reserve boundary to 300-500 m, with the highest point at 536.6 m. There are valleys with small streams and three reservoirs at the edge of the reserve.

THREATENED SPECIES: Syrmaticus reevesii (VU), Emberiza sulphurata (VU)

BIOMES: AS08: Sino-Himalayan subtropical forest

IMPORTANCE TO OTHER FAUNA AND FLORA: Nationally protected animals include *Panthera pardus, Neofelis nebulosa, Cervus nippon, Manis pentadactyla, Viverricula indica* and *Viverra zibetha*.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Jiangxi Wuyi Shan Nature Reserve is located at the southern tip of Qianshan County, and has a core area of 2,649 ha. The nature reserve lies at the north-western slope of Huanggang Shan (2,158 m), and is adjacent to Fujian Wuyi Shan Nature Reserve.

The IBA comprises subtropical mountains, and has more than 10 peaks above 1,500 m.

Threatened species: Tragopan caboti (VU), Syrmaticus ellioti (VU)

ENDEMIC BIRD AREAS: 141: South-east Chinese mountains

BIOMES: AS08: Sino-Himalayan subtropical forest

IMPORTANCE TO OTHER FAUNA AND FLORA: Nationally protected plants include Bretschneidera sinensis, Emmenopterys henryi, Liriodendron chinense and Ginkgo biloba. Nationally protected insects include Teinopalpus aureus. Animals include Neofelis nebulosa, Manis pentadactyla, Capricornis sumatraensis, Viverricula indica, Viverra zibetha and Felis temmincki.

CONSERVATION STATUS: Established as a provincial-level nature reserve in 1981, and

upgraded to a national nature reserve in 2000.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Jinggang Shan Nature Reserve is located in Jinggang Shan City, and it has a core area of 3,266 ha. It is a northern extension of the Nanling mountains, and it lies within the central subtropical region. Forest cover is 87.6%, and there is prominent vertical zonation of the vegetation.

THREATENED SPECIES: Tragopan caboti (VU), Syrmaticus ellioti (VU)

ENDEMIC BIRD AREAS: 141: South-east Chinese mountains

BIOMES: AS08: Sino-Himalayan subtropical forest

IMPORTANCE TO OTHER FAUNA AND FLORA: Nationally protected plants include Fokienia hodginsii, Tsoongiodendron odorum, Bretschneidera sinensis, Emmenopterys henryi and Ginkgo biloba. Animals include Panthera pardus, Neofelis nebulosa, Manis pentadactyla, Capricornis sumatraensis, Viverricula indica, Viverra zibetha, Lutra lutra and Naemorhedus goral.

CONSERVATION STATUS: Established as a nature reserve in 1975, upgraded to provincial level in 1981 and to a national nature reserve in 2003. The reserve joined the MAB network in 1995, the first reserve in Jiangxi to join the network. It was established as a national forest park in January 2006.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Located on the border between Guangdong and Jiangxi Provinces, in the Nan Ling mountains. The IBA has dense subtropical broadleaf evergreen forests.

THREATENED SPECIES: Gorsachius magnificus (EN), Tragopan caboti (VU), Pitta nympha (VU)

ENDEMIC BIRD AREAS: 141: South-east Chinese mountains

BIOMES: AS08: Sino-Himalayan subtropical forest

IMPORTANCE TO OTHER FAUNA AND FLORA: Many of the plants are of ancient origin, including *Ginkgo biloba* and tree-ferns.
